



Citizenship Language Pack For Migrants in Europe



A second improved version of the L-Pack Manual is now available!

The L-Pack materials are specially designed for adult migrants in Spain, Italy, Greece, German, Lithuania and Czech Republic who have only basic knowledge of national language and want to improve their language skills according to level A2 set by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). The L-Pack materials provide them with the necessary **colloquial language structures** in order to facilitate their social and cultural integration. The vocabulary comprises terms from various areas of general interest for migrants such as: "Authorities", "Communication", "Family and Socialising", "Health", "Job Hunting", "Leisure Time", "Looking for Accommodation", "School", "Self Education", "Shopping", "Travelling" and "Working Life." The students will learn how to use the appropriate language in particular situations and they will be able to adapt and practice their vocabulary according to everyday life.

In order to adapt the first version of the L-Pack teaching material to the special needs of migrants, from January until May 2012 the pilot courses were accomplished by all partners of the project in their countries. For evaluation and improving the manuals, at the end of the pilot courses special questionnaires were distributed and analysed on a national basis. The results were reassessed in a global report and were valuable for the final adaptations which are now included in the second improved version of the L-Pack Manual.
