



Citizenship Language Pack For Migrants in Europe

The “L-Pack: Citizenship Language Pack for Migrants in Europe” project focuses on the development of “a pack” of **colloquial language learning exercises** (L-PACK) for adult migrants in 6 European languages: the three languages of the EU countries that attract the highest number of migrants not speaking the national language

German, Italian and Spanish

plus three other less widely used and taught languages:

modern Greek, Czech and Lithuanian.

The project content is specifically developed to cover the needs of adult migrants that have only basic knowledge of national language and wish to further develop their language skills, according to level A2 set by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

L-PACK will consist of the following language learning products: **60 short videos with dialogues** related to everyday life, **audio-files** and **exercises** available through **Wikibooks**, **YouTube** and **Mypodcast**, as well as **language and country information** with **vocabulary for each language**.

The products are focused on themes such as settling in a new country, entering the local labour market and communicating in the workplace in 6 countries, namely Spain, Italy, Germany, Greece, the Czech Republic and Lithuania, thus providing a way to ease migrants’ social and labour market integration and to reflect the cultural context of the destination countries.

L-PACK is addressed to language teachers, organisations of adult education, adult migrants in Spain, Italy, Greece, the Czech Republic and Lithuania, organisations helping migrants’ insertion in these countries or any other interested parties such as people interested in learning one of the target languages.

Moreover, the project partnership will produce two short guides for teachers and migrants on how to use L-PACK, train teachers and disseminate L-PACK through Wikibooks, YouTube and Mypodcast as well as create a channel on YouTube collecting videos for language learning addressed to migrants.

The project is run by a consortium of three universities and four adult training organizations in Europe.



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
